Governor Nicole Kringstad

- 3 R's- Retain, Recruit, Rebrand
 - Retain- we have on an average lost 6-7% of our membership year after year for the last, for the last 5 years



- If we aren't retaining the members, we currently have a problem
- Yes, lives change, people move, people get busy but most CRA reports come in saying people are leaving due to Lack of Interest
- What are we doing to lose their interest? Are we not providing what they are looking for? Are we sitting stuck in our old ways and not exploring new projects and ideas?
- We have lost 34 members so far this year, 90% due to lack of interest
- As leaders we need to work to retain these members. Maybe you send out a survey to your club to see what they would be interested in, or giving those members you haven't see for a while a call to check in
- o **Recruit-** Currently DMM has 1646 members
- The good news is we have brought in 31 new members for a net of negative 3 so far
- New membership incentive, if the district is a net + then the clubs with a positive in membership that quarter gets \$50 a member they brought in, excluding FOOs or Transfers. Document will be sent out
- Hold a NOW meeting NOW, so many clubs have holiday projects coming up, now is the time to get them involved and active right away
- Every new member (not FOOs) is receiving a handwritten not from the Governor. We want those members to feel welcomed right away and get them involved. It will help with retention!
- New club building- working to add clubs in MN, JOI Club in Thompson
- Rebrand-Let's stop being the best kept secret and start being the best-known service organization
- Post and share what you do on your club's Facebook pages
- Submit big things to the local newspaper



- Wear your Optimist gear when out and about, especially at your projects!
- Post about it on your personal social media-don't hide the work you and your club do, brag it up, let people know about it!
- Make sure to use your club's logo on your documents
