President Tom Kendall encouraged all members to **Bee the Change**—and that begins with each of us.

One of the most meaningful ways to share optimism is by expanding our reach. Invite someone to join you at a meeting — one simple invitation can spark a lasting connection. You might also consider starting a new Optimist club in a nearby community.

If your club is currently below its membership goal, now is the perfect time to act. Let's work together to bring your numbers back to +0—or even beyond. Each new member adds fresh energy, new ideas, and greater opportunities to serve.

I'm truly proud of everything we've accomplished this year.

Let's keep the momentum going—keep inviting, keep growing, and keep bee-ing the change.

We can do this.

Optimism isn't just a mindset—it's a skill you can build (and unlike assembling banquet tables, there are no extra screws left over). As members of Optimist International, we're part of a global movement focused on bringing out the best in youth, our communities, and ourselves. Here's how you can strengthen your optimism while also using OI tools to support your club's success.

Start with Positive Focus

Optimists don't ignore challenges—they choose to focus on possibilities. When something doesn't go as planned, ask: What can we learn? What's the next step? This mindset helps your club stay energized and forward-thinking.

Turn Action into Impact

Optimism grows when you take action. Whether it's organizing a youth event or volunteering, each project builds confidence and purpose. That's why documenting your work matters—it shows the real impact your club is making.

Share your Achievements

Submitting a project report is one of the easiest ways to celebrate your success and inspire others. Here's a simple approach: Gather key details: project name, date, location, and number of participants. Describe the purpose: what need did your project address? Highlight outcomes: who benefited and how? Submit through OI: log in to the OI website and follow the reporting steps. These reports not only track your achievements—they also help share ideas across clubs worldwide. (see page 3 that will show you *How to... Enter Your Events to access your Club Project Impact Report.*)

Professional Development

The Optimist International Institute website offers a variety of helpful videos to support members at every level. To access them: Log in to the Optimist International Institute website. Navigate to the member resources or training section. Browse available video topics (leadership, project ideas, club growth, and more). Watch at your own pace and share with fellow members. These videos are a great way to stay inspired and learn new ways to strengthen your club—plus you can pause them whenever someone says, "Wait...where do I click?" (see page 4 that says *How to...Professional Development Program.*)

Share Optimism Daily

People imagine change happening through dramatic moments: a bold decision, a breakthrough, or a movie-style montage with inspirational music. But real progress is usually quieter.

Skills grow through daily practice. Trust builds through small acts like listening, showing up, or replying to texts before they become historical documents. Communities get stronger because ordinary people keep helping each other. These moments may seem insignificant, but they compound.

How to... Enter Your Events on the Club Project Impact Report

- Step 1:** Log in to Optimist International website – www.optimist.org
Left Corner of the screen: Enter your Optimist Leaders log in – **Click Enter**
- Step 2:** Enter your email address and your password – **Click login**
This will take you to the Optimist leaders screen
- Step 3: *Under club level*** Click on your club - Scroll to bottom of screen
- Step 4:** Select Club Project Impact Report (It should say Welcome Club with your club's number)
- Step 5:** Click on the blue - Start New Project Report.

Follow the prompts - Answer the following questions....

1. Is the project a Signature Program (OI project example-oratorical) or Community Project
Click Next
2. Select Project Type – Click next
3. Which group did you serve? Click next
4. Approximate number of youth that were served? Click next
5. Approximate number of volunteers? Click next
6. Volunteer hours per person? Click Next (it will total number of hours)
7. Cost of Project? Click next
8. Did you collaborate with any other organization? Yes or No? Click next
9. If yes, it will ask you What organization did you collaborate with – (Drop Down box - if your organization that you collaborated with is not there, select – **other** - then Click next
10. Additional Information – this is where you share about the program. Click next.
11. Review and Submit - Confirm that information is accurate and complete – if so,
12. Click submit.
13. Screen will populate back to your original login screen

*Note: Once you have clicked on submit, you **cannot** delete that report. Your report will be saved and added to any of your information that you have already submitted. Just an FYI, OI is working on tweaking the report before the end of the year so they can be edited or deleted if you forgot and previously added an event.*

How to... Officer Training for Optimist International Institute

Have you elected your officers for 2026 and updated those names on your club's page with Optimist International? Names are due now.

If you have updated your officers on the OI website, all Presidents, Secretaries, Treasurers, and Foundation Representatives should have received an email from Optimist International with a new password to enroll in the OI Institute for officer training. This is a suggested required training for officers. (Even if you have been treasurer for 25 years for your club.)

To sign in:

Step 1: Use the email address currently on file with Optimist International

Step 2: Use the Institute password: 2026institute

Once signed in, you'll find a variety of training materials. Be sure to select the officer training for your specific position. Most training programs include about four sections to complete. When finished, you should receive a certificate of completion.

Some sections also include a short quiz after the training materials. If you answer a question incorrectly, the correct answer will be shown, and you can continue right away — so no pressure!

How to... Professional Development Program

Optimist International Institute

The Professional Development Program, commonly called PDP, was revamped in September 2025. Everyone starts at level 1. The PDP is accessed through the Optimist Institute.

Step 1: Go to <https://optimist.tovuti.io/>

Note that all Optimist Institute memberships expire on April 30 each year. On May 1 or the first time you log into the Optimist Institute after May 1, you will need to renew your subscription. For renewal instructions, please reach out to DMM Leadership Development Chair Susan Fix or Governor Cricket Palmer. If you are a first time member, your password is 2026institute.

Step 2: Log in with your email address and password

Below are two ways to access the Professional Development.

- Click on Courses in the left pane, select Professional Development Program in the Category box at the top, and click on the Search button.
- Click on Courses by Category and scroll down to select Professional Development Program and then click on either the name at the top or the blue View Courses button.

There are five activities in each level.

1. Self-Exploration
2. Personal Leadership Development
3. Leading Others
4. Communication Skills
5. Community Involvement

The first four activities may include taking a self-exploration quiz on another website, reading about the topic, watching a video, placing correct words in a sentence, and taking a quiz to ensure you understand the material.

If there is a video, you must watch and listen to the entire video. Look at the time that displays at the bottom of the screen to make sure it has run out before going to the next item. When you finish one activity, the progress circle will show that you have completed 20% of that level.

For each Community Involvement activity, take a selfie and upload that. That is reviewed by someone at Optimist International and may take two weeks or longer.

All five activities in a level must be completed before you can advance to the next level.

How to... Turn Your Win Into Impact – What's left to do before September 30, 2026

- **Enter your new 2026-27 officers through the Optimist International website.**
- **Register for the Convention in Rapid City South Dakota – form attached.**
- **Fill out the Club Impact Report on the Optimist International Website before September 30, 2026 (use to be the pride report)**
- **Ask a friend to join your club. Get your Optimist Club membership back to +0 or beyond**
- **Presidents – be sure to submit a member from your club for the BEE the Change Awards to our DMM Governor.**
